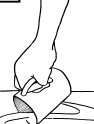

ACTIVITY 12: PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS

The group can use the cards as follows:

- **Open ended story:** Each person takes a card and explains what they see and what will happen as a result.
- **SWAG (Story with a Gap)** Take two cards to show 'Before' and 'After' and explain what happened in between the two cards.
- **Make a full story:** Select series of cards to show a problem and how it was solved.

Discuss how water can be more effectively delivered to the community using existing resources.

How can water be saved? How can communal facilities be kept operational?

If the water is being wasted by leakages, vandalism or bad practice how can this be solved?

How can the area be kept clean so that water is not contaminated below ground?
