In 2019 the City of Bulawayo experienced unprecedented water supply challenges which resulted in the decommissioning of three (3) of the city's six (6) major supply dams and the introduction of a gruelling 144-hour water rationing schedule. To cope with the challenges of only receiving piped water supplies once per week on average, the city's residents turned to communal boreholes, most of which are now in a state of disrepair due to heavy use. Pictured above are some of the boreholes assessed for rehabilitation works under the COVID-19 Preparedness and Response Project.
